Below is a list of top destinations in the Garden for families with kids.

During your visit, encourage your kids to be active investigators by looking for wildlife, smelling herbs and flowers and counting flower petals. Be amazed at the bees and butterflies fluttering around and don't be surprised if you find other garden wildlife like squirrels, birds, ladybugs and beetles. Lou Glenn Children's Garden (plan to spend about a one hour here)

- If it's a warm day (usually between June - September), bring swimsuits, swim diapers and towels for a splash in the Splash Pad.
- Watch the bees buzz and make honey in the observation beehive.
- Kids can test their balance crossing the bouncy bridges and walking along a sparkly corn snake
- Visit the soggy bog to look for bullfrogs and fish in the pond and to learn more about carnivorous, meat eating, plants like Venus Flytraps and native Pitcher Plants.
- Build an imaginary structure with incredibly light building materials at the balsa wood building area.
- Show off your creativity and paint with water at the slate wall.
- Climb and slide at the adventurous treehouse.
- Gently touching plants is OK in the Children's Garden.

Fuqua Conservatory

- Stop in the Fuqua Conservatory Lobby to look at the amphibian displays. How many frogs can you find? How do they all look different?
- Listen to the calling frogs in the Tropical Rotunda. You may hear the trill of the Phantasmal Poison Dart Frog or the distinctive "CO-KEE" of the Coqui frogs.
- Find the cacao tree in the Tropical Rotunda. Chocolate is made from the seeds of the cacao plant.
- Explore the diversity of orchids in the Fuqua Orchid Center. Which ones smell good or bad? How do they all look different?

Find your favorite fruit and vegetables growing in the **Edible Garden**.

In the **Rose Garden** can you find all the colors in a rainbow - red, orange, yellow, green, blue and purple?
