

# fresh art and music itinerary

**The Garden is more than just plants; it's an outdoor art museum and occasionally a musical venue to boot. Here are some ways to experience art and music while here:**

- Explore the many sculptures throughout the Garden, including works in the permanent collection such as Dale Chihuly's *Parterre Fountain Installation*, *Nepenthes Chandelier* in the Hardin Visitor Center and *Saffron Tower* in Storza Woods. Be sure to see the artist's colorful "drawings" in Longleaf.
- Interested in creating your own works of art? Explore the Botanical Drawing Program classes on the Garden's website. From drawing in black and white to colorful inks and watercolor, you'll be making your own Garden-inspired masterpieces in no time.
- There also are several metal sculptures of kinetic art from 2008's *Sculpture in Motion* exhibition.
- Don't miss the "living sculptures" that are legacies from previous *Imaginary Worlds* exhibitions of mosaiculture, including the *Earth Goddess* and *Shaggy Dog* at the Midtown garden and the *Frogs* in Gainesville.
- Fans of outdoor musical performances relish every summer's Concerts in the Garden series staged under the stars on the Great Lawn.
- On Thursday evenings from spring through fall, enjoy deejays and live bluegrass music during Cocktails in the Garden and Fest-of-Ale, respectively.
- The Garden also occasionally partners with other cultural attractions such as the Atlanta Opera, the Atlanta Ballet and the Alliance Theatre to present musical, dance and theatrical performances on site.
