## **Drawing Orchids in Black & White Materials List**

- 1. Bring Basic Black and White Drawing Materials:
  - 14" x 17" All Purpose Drawing Pad or 14" x 17" Bristol Board Pad
  - Set of five basic drawing pencils: 6B, 4B, 2B, HB, 2H (+B)
  - 1-2 Fine line black pen: Le Pen, .03 Staedler or .03 Micron
  - (General) Charcoal Pencil: Extra Soft, Soft (required) optional: Medium, Hard
  - #3 Stump Blender (grey paper cylinder use with charcoal)
  - One sheet medium grade sandpaper
  - Manual pencil sharpener with 2 openings: brass or silver metal (keep in Ziploc bag)
  - Small pair scissors/single edge razor blade
  - Erasers: Pink Pearl Erasers, White Plastic (Magic Rub), Grey Kneaded, Eraser Tips (pink pearl and white plastic)
  - Magnifying Glass
  - 8" X 10" Clear, Vertical Plexi-Glass frame with foot
  - Small, lightweight flashlight
  - Lightweight plastic box with handle for carrying art materials
  - Clear Plastic Ruler 1" wide with red rule lines:  $\frac{1}{16}$ " |  $\frac{1}{8}$ " |  $\frac{1}{4}$ " |  $\frac{1}{2}$ " | etc.
  - 14" x 17" heavy vinyl carrying bag with handle to carry drawing pads and other materials
  - Small, digital camera for photo documentation
- 2. 20" X 30" (17" X 28") White Styrofoam Board 3/16" 1/4" thick

This will be used to make your "still life stage" (Instructor will assist you.)

## 3. An Orchid

Select an orchid with a pattern and deeper colors. Please avoid white or pale colors. (18" tall from the bottom of the pot to top/blooms at eyelevel when you are sitting at table) Lady slipper orchids and pansy orchids (Miltonia) are excellent.

4. White Artist's Tape and 11" x 14" Canson Tracing Paper pad (for problem solving)
